TIGER GOLF STARTS SPRING SEASON

ANTEATER INVITATIONAL • After a two week break the Tigers continue their spring season, traveling to Southern California for the Anteater Invitational on February 26-28. The UC Irvine hosted tournament takes place at the Mesa Verde Country Club in Coasta Mesa, California. The Monday-Tuesday event kicks-off with 36-holes beginning Monday morning and a final round 18 starting at 7:30 am on Tuesday.

Last year the Tigers took home fifth place in the event, shooting a 295-300-321=916. Andrew Bostrom led Pacific with a seven-over 223 and then sophomore Thomas Petersson contributed a 230 to finish in a tie for 22nd. Senior Gordian Curtius and sophomore Chris Rosenau also played the event last year, shooting a 239 and 241, respectively, at El Niguel Country Club.

RICE INTERCOLLEGIATE • The Pacific golf team kicked off their spring season this past week at the Rice Intercollegiate in Missouri City, Texas. Led by junior Thomas Petersson the Tigers finished fifth in the 14-team tournament. Petersson carded a 72 during the final round to finish in a tie for ninth, just four strokes off the lead. His 76-75 first day score at the par-70 Willowisp Country Club gave him a 54-hole total of 223. Right behind him was sophomore standout Chris Rosenau, shooting an even 70 on the 6,700-yard Houston-area course. Rosenau's 70 proved to be the low score of the tournament as well as a career best for

the Redding, California native. Freshman Adam Beckman finished with a 73 to put him in 39th place and freshman Charles Van Sicklen's overall 232 gave him a 45th place finish. Santa Clara claimed the team title by shooting a two-day score of 304-289-296=889 and Colorado State's Derrick Whiting won a playoff after carding a 72-77-70=219 during the tournament.



Petersson recorded his third Top-10 finish at the Rice Intercollegiate, shooting a 54-score of 223 at Willowisp Country Club.

THE FALL CAMPAIGN • The Pacific golf team completed their first season under new head coach Brandon Goethals, finishing in the Top 10 in three of their five tournaments during their fall campaign. The Tigers were led by junior Thomas Petersson and sophomore Chris Rosenau, both of whom which paced Pacific in two tournaments during the past semester. Petersson finished in the Top-10 twice; tying for seventh at The Prestige at PGA West and an eighth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate in November. Senior Gordian Curtius contributed the top finish of the season, tying for third at the Bill Cullum.

As a team the Tigers carded five rounds of sub-par golf with Petersson shooting a four-under 68 at the Cullum Intercollegiate. Three Tigers, Petersson, Rosenau and redshirt freshman Charles Van Sicklen played in all 15 rounds during the first half of the year and four other players saw action in various tournaments.



Curtius finished third this past fall at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate, shooting a 217, 54-hole score.

The Tigers finished ninth in both the Lexus Classic and Santa Clara Invitational before ending the season with a fourth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate.

Before arriving at Pacific, Goethals had just completed his fourth year as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech under head coach Bruce Hepler. He helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a runner-up finish at the 2005 NCAA Golf Championships in Owings Mills, Maryland. He played a large part in recruiting the last three years, and successfully recruited four players over the course of two years that were ranked in the Top-30 nationally.

Spring 2006 • Thomas picked up where he left off in the Tigers' first tournament of the spring season, leading Pacific to a fifth place finish at the Rice Intercollegiate on his way to a ninth place finish. Petersson shot a 76-75-72=223 enroute to his third Top 10 showing in six tournaments.

Fall 2005 • Petersson showed great improvement during the fall semester of his junior year, posting two Top-10 finishes at the Lexus Classic (T7) and the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate (8). He fired a career-low round of 68 in the Cullum and led the Tigers with a 74.4 stroke average. Thomas shot in the 70's in 13 of his 15 rounds as well as two rounds of under par and the second highest finish of any Tiger.

TIGERS SHOOT 307-302-295=904 AT WILLOWISP COUNTRY CLUB

Missouri City, Texas • Paced by strong performances from junior Thomas Petersson and sophomore Chris Rosenau the Pacific golf team moved up to finish in fifth place at the Rice Intercollegiate Tuesday, February 7.

The Tigers capped off the tournament by shooting a 295, seven strokes better than their second round performance on Monday. Petersson carded a 72 on the 6,700-yard Willowisp Country Club to finish just four strokes off the lead with a 223. Rosenau shot an even par 70 during his final round to finish 12th, a single stroke behind Petersson at 224. Rosenau's 70 tied his career low and tied him for the lowest round of the tournament.

Freshman Adam Beckman finished with a 73 to put him in 39th place and freshman Charles Van Sicklen's overall 232 gave him a 45th place finish.

Former Tiger Standout Matt Hansen Joins The PGA Tour

HANSEN EARNED HIS TOUR CARD AFTER FINISHING THE Q-SCHOOL QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT

Winter Garden, Fla. • Former Tiger standout and All-American Matt Hansen earned his PGA Tour card on Monday, December 5, giving him a spot on the PGA Tour in 2006. Hansen qualified for the tour by finishing in the top-30 at the PGA's Q-School Qualifying Tournament. Hansen was one of 32 players to earn tour status for the 2006 season.

Hansen finished the marathon, six round event, at 12-under par, finishing in a tie for 18th place at the tournament. Hansen finished the tournament with three rounds under-70, shooting a 69 in the opening round and two rounds of 68 in the fourth and fifth rounds.

While at Pacific, Hansen earned All-American honors in 2002 after finishing in a tie for the Big West Individual title. Hansen went to the NCAA tournament in each of his four seasons at Pacific, either with the Tigers as a team or as an individual competitor. In addition to his All-American honors, Hansen was a three-time member of the All-Big West team, earning honorable mention status in 2001 before earning back-to-back first team selections in 2002 and 2003.
