TIGERS TAKE FIFTH AT RAIN-SHORTENED ANTEATER INVITATIONAL

BRAVEHEART CLASSIC • The Tigers pick up their spring season at the UC Riverside hosted Braveheart Classic next week. The Classic will be played at the Oak Valley Golf Club in Beaumont, California on March 6 & 7.

The Oak Valley Golf Club, located between the San Gorgonio and San Jacinto mountains, is a par-72, 7,003-yard course. Opening round play begins Monday morning with 36-holes during the first day and a final 18 concluding Tuesday afternoon. This is the first time Pacific has played in the tournament.

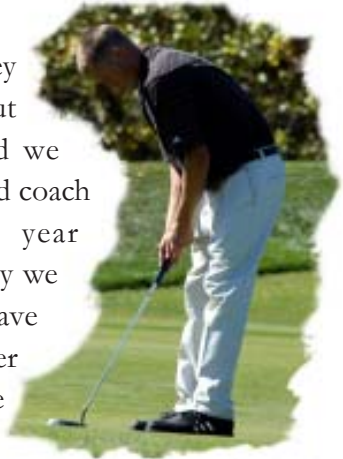
ANTEATER INVITATIONAL • The Pacific golf team finished the Anteater Invitational in fifth place after heavy rains forced third-round play to be cancelled. The Tigers shot a 294-304=598 for the tournament at the Mesa Verde Country Club.

Junior Thomas Petersson shot a one-under 69 to open things up for Pacific and followed up with a 79 on the par-70, 6,695-yard course. His 15th place finish (148) led the Tigers at the UC Irvine hosted event and left him nine strokes back from the eventual leader, Travis Bertoni of Cal Poly. Bertoni carded a 69-70=139.

Sophomore Chris Rosenau played to a 74-75=149 to finish in 19th place and freshman Adam Beckman fired a 78-72, 21st overall. Sophomore A.J. Hohn shot a 73-83 and freshman Charles Van Sicklen

(Stockton, Calif.) finished in 46th after shooting an 83-78.

“I’m proud of the guys, the way they went out and played yesterday, but we gave away some strokes and we can’t do that at this level,” said head coach Brandon Goethals. “As the year progresses we need to play the way we do at home, on the road. I would have liked to see us put things together today but unfortunately with the rains we didn’t get that chance.”

THE FALL CAMPAIGN • The Pacific golf team completed their first season under new head coach Brandon Goethals, finishing in the Top 10 in three of their five tournaments during their fall campaign. The Tigers were led by junior Thomas Petersson and sophomore Chris Rosenau, both of whom which paced Pacific in two tournaments during the past semester. Petersson finished in the Top-10 twice; tying for seventh at The Prestige at PGA West and an eighth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate in November. Senior Gordian Curtius contributed the top finish of the season, tying for third at the Bill Cullum. As a team the Tigers carded five rounds of sub-par golf with Petersson shooting a four-under 68 at the Cullum Intercollegiate. Three Tigers, Petersson, Rosenau and redshirt freshman Charles Van Sicklen played in all 15 rounds during the first half of the year and four other players saw action in various tournaments.

COACH'S CORNER

Brandon Goethals



I was very excited about the Anteater Invitational as I thought the layout and condition of the golf course would give our team a great opportunity to learn. We didn't execute during the second round as we would have liked, but there were some positives about the event.

Thomas Petersson found himself tied for the lead after a first round, one-under 69. That is the first time all year that we had someone in the lead of a golf tournament and I was proud of how Thomas conducted himself throughout the tournament.

As for the learning part, we worked hard this week on learning how to hit off-speed shots into the greens. In other words, we worked on hitting shots into the greens that didn't have a lot of spin on them (usually by taking extra club). The greens were very receptive at Mesa Verde and if you hit a full shot into the greens, they would usually spin far away from the hole leaving you a difficult putt. I thought we improved a lot in this area and look forward to continued success.

We are off to the Braveheart Classic in Beaumont, Calif. on Monday and Tuesday of this week. This is another opportunity for us to learn and improve. We will work diligently and professionally during the entire trip and hopefully gain as much knowledge as possible.

Coach Goethals

First year head coach Brandon Goethals has wasted no time in reinventing the Pacific golf program, guiding the Tigers to a successful fall season in his first semester at the helm. The Tigers finished ninth in both the Lexus Classic and Santa Clara Invitational before ending the season with a fourth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate.

Before arriving at Pacific, Goethals had just completed his fourth year as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech under head coach Bruce Heppler. He helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a runner-up finish at the 2005 NCAA Golf Championships in Owings Mills, Maryland. He played a large part in recruiting the last three years, and successfully recruited four players over the course of two years that were ranked in the Top-30 nationally.

Spring 2006 • Thomas picked up where he left off in the Tigers' first tournament of the spring season, leading Pacific to a fifth place finish at the Rice Intercollegiate on his way to a ninth place finish. Petersson shot a 76-75-72=223 enroute to his third Top 10 showing in six tournaments. He also took top honors for Pacific at the Anteater Invitational, finishing 15th.

Fall 2005 • Petersson showed great improvement during the fall semester of his junior year, posting two Top-10 finishes at the Lexus Classic (T7) and the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate (8). He fired a career-low round of 68 in the Cullum and led the Tigers with a 74.4 stroke average. Thomas shot in the 70's in 13 of his 15 rounds as well.

TIGERS SHOOT 307-302-295=904 AT WILLOWISP COUNTRY CLUB

Feb. 7, 2006

Missouri City, Texas • Paced by strong performances from junior Thomas Petersson and sophomore Chris Rosenau the Pacific golf team moved up to finish in fifth place at the Rice Intercollegiate Tuesday, February 7.

The Tigers capped off the tournament by shooting a 295, seven strokes better than their second round performance on Monday. Petersson carded a 72 on the 6,700-yard Willowisp Country Club to finish just four strokes off the lead with a 223. Rosenau shot an even par 70 during his final round to finish 12th, a single stroke behind Petersson at 224. Rosenau's 70 tied his career low and tied him for the lowest round of the tournament.

Freshman Adam Beckman finished with a 73 to put him in 39th place and freshman Charles Van Sicklen's overall 232 gave him a 45th place finish. Santa Clara claimed the team title by shooting a twoday score of 304-289-296=889 and Colorado State's Derrick Whiting won a playoff after carding a 72-77-70=219 during the tournament.

Former Tiger Standout Matt Hansen Joins The PGA Tour

HANSEN EARNS TOUR CARD AFTER FINISHING Q-SCHOOL TOURNAMENT

Dec. 5, 2005

Winter Garden, Fla. • Former Tiger standout and All-American Matt Hansen earned his PGA Tour card on Monday, December 5, giving him a spot on the PGA Tour in 2006. Hansen qualified for the tour by finishing in the Top 30 at the PGA's Q-School Qualifying Tournament. Hansen was one of 32 players to earn tour status for the 2006 season.

Hansen finished the marathon, six round event, at 12-under par, finishing in a tie for 18th place at the tournament. Hansen finished the tournament with three rounds under-70, shooting a 69 in the opening round and two rounds of 68 in the fourth and fifth rounds.

While at Pacific, Hansen earned All-American honors in 2002 after finishing in a tie for the Big West Individual title. Hansen went to the NCAA tournament in each of his four seasons at Pacific, either with the Tigers as a team or as an individual competitor. In addition to his All-American honors, Hansen was a three-time member of the All-Big West team, earning honorable mention status in 2001 before earning back-to-back first team selections in 2002 and 2003.
