PACIFIC GOLF 17TH AT BRAVEHEART CLASSIC

TIGERS SURVIVE ROUGH WEEKEND IN BEAUMONT, LOOKING AHEAD TO DIABLO GRANDE

DIABLO GRANDE INTERCOLLEGIATE

Due to a rain-shortened Anteater Invitational on February 28 the Tigers were allowed, by NCAA regulations, to add another tournament to their spring schedule. This Sunday and Monday, March 19-20, the Pacific golf team will compete at the Diablo Grande Intercollegiate.

The Drake University hosted event is held at the Diablo Grande Ranch Course in Patterson, California. The teams will begin their 54-hole tournament with the first round Sunday and will conclude Monday afternoon with the final 36-holes.

Last year Cal-Davis took home the team honors, shooting a 54-hole score of 904 at the par 72, 7,018-yard course. Individually, host school Drake's Mike Schnegelberger and Cal-Davis' Jay Westerlund tied for medalist honors, both shooting a 221 over the three-day event. This is the first time the Tigers have taken part in the Diablo Grande.

BRAVEHEART CLASSIC

The Pacific golf team finished the Braveheart Classic in 17th, Tuesday, March 7. Led by freshman Charles Van Sicklen's 230 the Tigers posted a 54-hole score of 313-306-316=935 at the Oak Glen Golf Course.

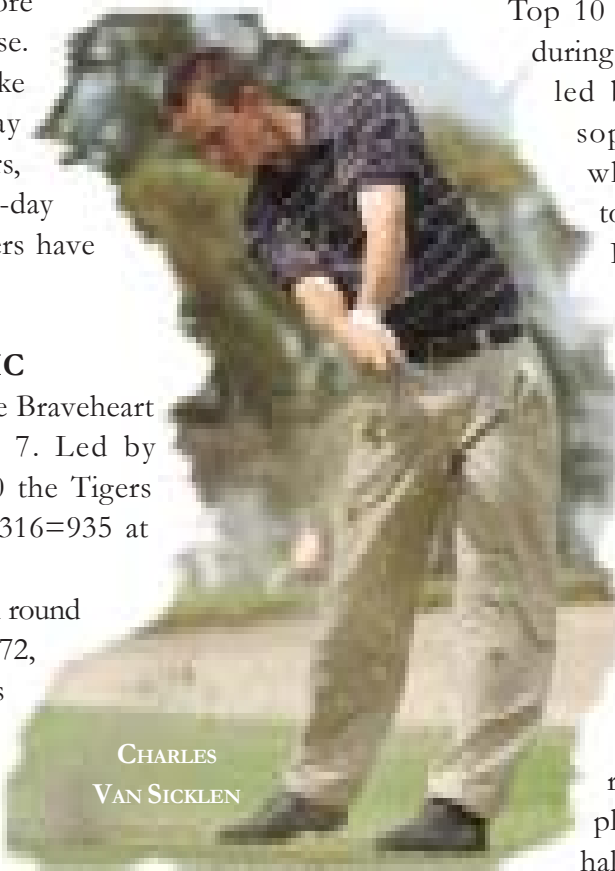
Van Sicklen shot a 74-78 and a final round 78 to finish tied for 58th at the par 72, 7,003-yard course. Junior Thomas Petersson and sophomore A.J. Hohn both shot 234's to tie for 71st place. Also finishing for Pacific was sophomore Chris Rosenau, shooting a 237 and freshman Adam Beckman (249).

"We just flat-out need to play better golf than we did this week," said head coach Brandon Goethals. "We're going to put this behind us and get to work this week. How we played was unacceptable."

UCLA took home the team title with an amazing 291-286-288=865; a combined single stroke over par. The Bruins were buoyed by individual winner Chris Heintz who carded a 69-70-70=209.

THE FALL CAMPAIGN

The Pacific golf team completed their first season under new head coach Brandon Goethals, finishing in the Top 10 in three of their five tournaments during their fall campaign. The Tigers were led by junior Thomas Petersson and sophomore Chris Rosenau, both of whom which paced Pacific in two tournaments during the past semester. Petersson finished in the Top-10 twice; tying for seventh at The Prestige at PGA West and an eighth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate in November. Senior Gordian Curtius contributed the top finish of the season, tying for third at the Bill Cullum. As a team the Tigers carded five rounds of sub-par golf with Petersson shooting a four-under 68 at the Cullum Intercollegiate. Three Tigers, Petersson, Rosenau and redshirt freshman Charles Van Sicklen played in all 15 rounds during the first half of the year and four other players saw action in various tournaments.

Coach Goethals

First year head coach Brandon Goethals has wasted no time in reinventing the Pacific golf program, guiding the Tigers to a successful fall season in his first semester at the helm. The Tigers finished ninth in both the Lexus Classic and Santa Clara Invitational before ending the season with a fourth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate.

Before arriving at Pacific, Goethals had just completed his fourth year as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech under head coach Bruce Heppler. He helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a runner-up finish at the 2005 NCAA Golf Championships in Owings Mills, Maryland. He played a large part in recruiting the last three years, and successfully recruited four players over the course of two years that were ranked in the Top-30 nationally.

Spring 2006 • Thomas picked up where he left off in the Tigers' first tournament of the spring season, leading Pacific to a fifth place finish at the Rice Intercollegiate on his way to a ninth place finish. Petersson shot a 76-75-72=223 enroute to his third Top 10 showing in six tournaments. He also took top honors for Pacific at the Anteater Invitational, finishing 15th and then carded a 234 at the Braveheart Classic.

PETERSSON'S 148, 15TH PLACE, IS LOW SCORE FOR PACIFIC

Feb. 28, 2006

Costa Mesa, California - The Pacific golf team finished the Anteater Invitational in fifth place after heavy rains forced third-round play to be cancelled. The Tigers shot a 294-304=598 for the tournament at the Mesa Verde Country Club.

Junior Thomas Petersson shot a one-under 69 to open things up for Pacific and followed up with a 79 on the par-70, 6,695-yard course. His 15th place finish (148) led the Tigers at the UC Irvine hosted event and left him nine strokes back from the eventual leader, Travis Bertoni of Cal Poly. Bertoni carded a 69-70=139.

Sophomore Chris Rosenau played to a 74-75=149 to finish in 19th place and freshman Adam Beckman fired a 78-72, 21st overall. Sophomore A.J. Hohn shot a 73-83 and freshman Charles Van Sicklen finished in 46th after shooting an 83-78.

"I'm proud of the guys, the way they went out and played yesterday, but we gave away some strokes and we can't do that at this level," said head coach Brandon Goethals. "As the year progresses we need to play the way we do at home, on the road. I would have liked to see us put things together today but unfortunately with the rains we didn't get that chance."

Santa Clara took the team title, shooting a 293-285=578. Arizona B finished in second at 584 and UC Irvine took third with a 586.

Pacific Golf Finishes Rice Intercollegiate In Fifth

TIGERS SHOOT 307-302-295=904 AT WILLOWISP COUNTRY CLUB

Feb. 7, 2006

Missouri City, Texas • Paced by strong performances from junior Thomas Petersson and sophomore Chris Rosenau the Pacific golf team moved up to finish in fifth place at the Rice Intercollegiate Tuesday, February 7.

The Tigers capped off the tournament by shooting a 295, seven strokes better than their second round performance on Monday. Petersson carded a 72 on the 6,700-yard Willowisp Country Club to finish just four strokes off the lead with a 223. Rosenau shot an even par 70 during his final round to finish 12th, a single stroke behind Petersson at 224. Rosenau's 70 tied his career low and tied him for the lowest round of the tournament.

Freshman Adam Beckman finished with a 73 to put him in 39th place and freshman Charles Van Sicklen's overall 232 gave him a 45th place finish. Santa Clara claimed the team title by shooting a twoday score of 304-289-296=889 and Colorado State's Derrick Whiting won a playoff after carding a 72-77-70=219 during the tournament.
