PACIFIC GOLF LOOKS FOR BIG FINISH AT BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIP

TIGERS COMPLETE REGULAR SEASON AT COWBOY CLASSIC

BIG WEST CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

The Pacific golf team closes out their spring season at the annual Big West Conference Tournament at Tijeras Creek Golf Club, April 24-25. The Tigers will spend the next week and a half preparing for the 6,888-yard, par 72 course in Rancho Santa Margarita, California. The golf team returns to the Orange Country public course, the site of last season's Big West Tournament as well. A year ago the Tigers finished seventh of the nine Big West schools, posting a team 54-hole score of 295-298-289=882. Then senior Matt Kern led Pacific with a 14th place finish, shooting a 77-72-69=218. Gordian Curtius posted a 74-74-72=220 and then freshman Chris Rosenau finished in 23rd after shooting a 70-78-73=221.

TIGERS 16th AT COWBOY CLASSIC

Scottsdale, Arizona - The Pacific golf team shot a combined 293-295-288 to finish in 16th place at the Wyoming Cowboy Classic, Tuesday, April 11. The Tigers finished their spring regular season with a 54-hole score of 876 at the 21-team tournament.

Spring scoring average leader Chris Rosenau opened the tournament with a two-under 68 Monday morning. The sophomore carded a 74-71 to finish in a tie for 25th place. Rosenau led the 54-hole Cleveland Golf sponsored golf classic with 43 pars.

Sophomore A.J. Hohn placed 60th at Talking Sticks North Course, posting a 76-71-72=219 at the 7,133-yard par 70 course. Freshman Charles Van Sicklen was next for the Tigers, shooting a 221 for a 70th place tie and junior Thomas Petersson carded a 76-75-74 over the two day event. Freshman Adam Beckman shot a 75-75-83=223 for Pacific as well.

"I was proud of Rosenau and Van Sicklen; both guys shot career-lows this week," said head coach Brandon Goethals. "However, we still need to get better as a team. We're going to take what we can from this, come out strong and give it our best at the Big West."

New Mexico State took the team title, shooting a 280-279-277=836. They were led by individual medalist Danny Bowen's five-under 205. Bowen defeated fellow teammate Ben Kreger in a playoff.

SPRING SUMMARY

Heading into the Big West Conference Championship on April 24-25 the Tigers have put together a spring campaign filled with the highs and lows that only golf can provide. Throughout the semester the golfers fought through their fair share of wind, rain and even darkness to play courses from Oregon to Texas and Arizona enroute to a successful spring season.

The Tigers jumped out to a great start to the season as they finished fifth at the Rice Intercollegiate, shooting a 904 in the 14-team field. Junior Thomas Petersson led the Tigers with a 223, his third top-10 finish of the 2005-06 year. Pacific again took fifth place at the Anteater Invitational the following week, once again led by stroke leader Thomas Petersson (75.4). At the Braveheart Classic in Beaumont on March 6th and 7th it was freshman Charles Van Sicklen who led the Tigers as they struggled, finishing 17th.

followed on March 24th when the Tigers met nationally ranked Georgia Tech at storied Pasatiempo Golf Course in Santa Cruz, California. The dual match, between head coach Brandon Goethals former team, Georgia Tech and the Tigers pitted eight players from each team against each other in a match-play format. Sophomore Chris Rosenau (75.5) was the only Tiger to win as he defeated Cameron Tringale 2-1. Senior Gordian Curtius and junior Reid Scarff battled darkness but fell on their final holes to their Yellow Jacket counterparts one up.

Following the dual match it was off to Oregon as the Tigers took part in the Oregon Duck Invitational at Shadow Hills Country Club in Eugene. Rosenau stayed hot, shooting a first round even 72 and a final round one under but finished 27th. This past weekend heavy rains forced the cancellation of the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate in Santa Barbara. However the Tigers collected a 16th place finish at the Cowboy Classic; Rosenau led Pacific with a first round 68 on his way to a 25th place finish. Rosenau and Petersson have remained neck-and-neck in leading the Tigers, shooting 74.5 and 75.3 averages over the five tournaments. In addition, Brett Giurlani, A.J. Hohn and Adam Beckman have all made contributions for the Tigers this semester.

Coach Goethals

First year head coach Brandon Goethals has wasted no time in reinventing the Pacific golf program, guiding the Tigers to a successful fall season in his first semester at the helm. The Tigers finished ninth in both the Lexus Classic and Santa Clara Invitational before ending the season with a fourth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate.

Before arriving at Pacific, Goethals had just completed his fourth year as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech under head coach Bruce Heppler. He helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a runner-up finish at the 2005 NCAA Golf Championships in Owings Mills, Maryland. He played a large part in recruiting the last three years, and successfully recruited four players over the course of two years that were ranked in the Top-30 nationally.

Spring 2006 • Thomas picked up where he left off in the Tigers' first tournament of the spring season, leading Pacific to a fifth place finish at the Rice Intercollegiate on his way to a ninth place finish. Petersson shot a 76-75-72=223 enroute to his third Top 10 showing in six tournaments. He also took top honors for Pacific at the Anteater Invitational, finishing 15th and then carded a 234 at the Braveheart Classic.

Fall 2005 • Petersson showed great improvement during the fall semester of his junior year, posting two Top-10 finishes at the Lexus Classic (T7) and the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate (8). He fired a career-low round of 68 in the Cullum and led the Tigers with a 74.4 stroke average. Thomas shot in the 70's in 13 of his 15 rounds as well.

Fall 2005 • Rosenau had a stellar fall season, playing in all five tournaments in which he shot 14 of 15 rounds in the 70's. Chris accumulated the team's second best stroke average at 74.9 and finished in a tie for 17th at the Prestige.

Pacific Coast Intercollegiate Cancelled

TIGER GOLFERS WILL NOT COMPETE DUE TO RAIN CANCELLED EVENT

Santa Barbara, Calif. - The Pacific Coast Intercollegiate Golf Tournament has been cancelled due to intense rain in the Santa Barbara area. The Tigers were scheduled to participate in the 17-team tournament at the Rancho San Marcos Golf Course on April 3-4.

Team were scheduled to tee-off this morning for 36-holes on Monday and a final 18 on Tuesday, however, with the course underwater and more rain on the way tournament officials decided to call off the 34th annual tournament.

Tigers Take Ninth at Oregon Duck Invitational

CHRIS ROSENAU'S 221 LEADS PACIFIC

March 28, 2006

Eugene, Oregon - The Pacific golf team finished the Oregon Duck Invitational in ninth place, Tuesday, March 28. The Tigers shot a 294-309 first day score and finished with a 304 at the Shadow Hills Country Club.

Sophomore Chris Rosenau shot an even 72 to opening things up for Pacific and followed that with a second round 78 and a final round one under, 71. Rosenau's 221 was good enough for 27th at the par-72, 7,007-yard course. Junior Thomas Petersson fired a final round 74 to finish tied for 36 at (225). Freshman Adam Beckman and Charles Van Sicklen shot 54-hole scores of 230 and 231, respectively. Reid Scarff, in his first event of the season, finished the tournament in 70th after carding a 75-80-83=238.

"We had a few good scores (during this final round) but it's unfortunate that we didn't get it done all around," said head coach Brandon Goethals. "Chris (Rosenau) had a good round, I'm proud of how he went out there today, on the final day and played tough."

Ryan Witz of Washington State and a Joe Panzeri took individual honors, both shooting 211's through 54-holes. San Diego State took the team title, shooting a two-day score of 288-278-288=854 to win by 12 strokes. The Tigers ninth place finish in the 12-team, Oregon hosted event; an improvement on a year ago when the Tigers placed 15th.

"The course was set up to score today," said Goethals. "It was a little breezy but the opportunities were there and we just flat out need to play better golf."

All five players improved on their season averages during the Duck Invitational. Petersson remains Pacific's stroke leader through 26 rounds, shooting an average of 74.8 with three rounds under par. Rosenau is second on the squad with a 75.1 average and leads the Tigers with 24 of his 26 rounds in the 70's.

Former Tiger Hansen Wins Northern California Classic

MATT HANSEN VICTORIOUS IN FOUR-WAY PLAYOFF IN CANADIAN TOUR EVENT

March 26, 2006

Stockton, Calif. • Former Pacific golfer Matt Hansen won the Northern California Classic Sunday, March 26. His 19-under 269 forced a four-way playoff at Brookside Country Club.

The PGA Tour rookie made a 10-foot birdie putt on 18 to force a four-way playoff with Jeff Quinney, Erik Compton and John Mallinger. On the extra playoff hole, 18, Hansen's chip hit the flagstick before resting six feet past the pin. He then drained the birdie putt as the other three ended with par.

"That was just awesome," said Hansen. "On the 18th green, I saw Quinney was finished at 19 and that I needed to make birdie. You have to take the mindset that everyone is going to make their putt, so I just tried to focus on what I had to do. There were some great players in that playoff. To get it done under pressure makes this pretty special"

Hansen shot a first round 67 at the par-72, 6,770-yard Brookside course. He followed that up with a nine-under 63 on day two and a two-under 70 for the third round.

Hansen's win is the first of his PGA Tour career; a career that began in 2006 when he earned his Tour Card by advancing to the final stage of Q-school. Hansen is next in action at the BellSouth Classic in Duluth, Georgia.
