## TIGERS END 2005-06 SEASON ON HIGH NOTE AT BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIP

PACIFIC GOLFERS FIRE LOWEST 54-HOLE SCORE OF THE YEAR AT TIJERAS CREEK

### TIGERS FIFTH AT BIG WEST CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

**Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.** • The Pacific golf team fired a season-low 292 to finish the Big West Conference Championship in fifth place, Tuesday, April 25. The Tigers shot five over par at Tijeras Creek Golf Club.

Freshman Charles Van Sicklen led Pacific with a three-day score of 74-73-73=220 to finish in a tie for 11th place while sophomore Chris Rosenau carded a final round one-over, 73 at Tijeras Creek's 6,918-yard course.

Junior Thomas Petersson opened the tournament with a 76 and 75 but finished strong Tuesday morning with an even 72 to finish in 21st place. Sophomore A.J. Hohn finished his second round strong, going two-under over the last 16 holes and fired a 76 this morning for the Tigers. Freshman Adam Beckman rounded out Pacific's scoring, rebounding from an opening round 78 to fire a two-over 74.

"To have the last round of our year be the best round of our year is something special," said Pacific head coach Brandon Goethals. "The guys fought hard and finished strong and I'm really proud of that. We're going to take that effort that we showed out there today and build on it for next year." Cal Poly took the team title, posting a combined 853 during the 54-hole event. Ryan Panichpakdee of Long Beach State rolled to the individual title by shooting a -16, 200.



### SPRING SUMMARY

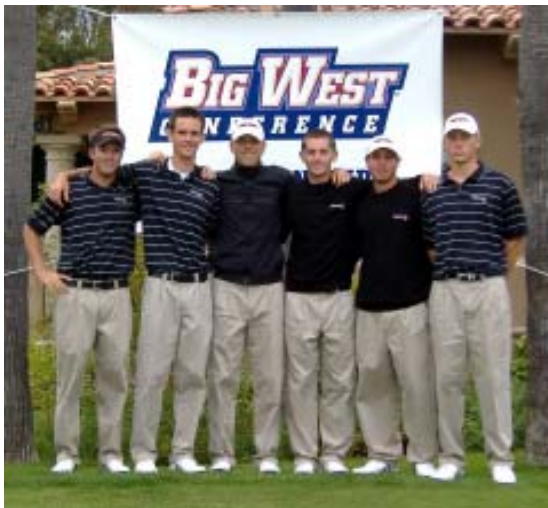
The Tigers have put together a spring campaign filled with the highs and lows that only golf can provide. Throughout the semester the golfers fought through their fair share of wind, rain and even darkness to play courses from Oregon to Texas and Arizona enroute to a successful spring season and a final fifth place finish at the Big West Championship.

The Tigers jumped out to a great start to the season as they finished fifth at the Rice Intercollegiate, shooting a 904 in the 14-team field. Junior Thomas Petersson led the Tigers with a 223, his third top-10 finish of the 2005-06 year. Pacific again took fifth place at the Anteater Invitational the following week, once again led by spring stroke leader Thomas Petersson (75.4). At the Braveheart Classic in Beaumont on March 6th and 7th it was redshirt freshman Charles Van Sicklen who led the Tigers as they struggled, finishing 17th.

A reunion of sorts followed on March 24th when the Tigers met nationally ranked Georgia Tech at storied Pasatiempo Golf Course in Santa Cruz, California. The dual match, between head coach Brandon Goethals former team, Georgia Tech and the Tigers pitted eight players from each team against each other in a match-play format. Sophomore Chris Rosenau (75.5) was the only Tiger to win as he defeated Cameron Tringale 2-1. Senior Gordian Curtius and junior Reid Scarff battled darkness but fell on their final holes to their Yellow Jacket counterparts one up.

Following the dual match it was off to Oregon as the Tigers took part in the Oregon Duck Invitational at Shadow Hills Country Club in Eugene. Rosenau stayed hot, shooting a first round even 72 and a final round one under but finished 27th. This past weekend heavy rains forced the cancellation of the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate in Santa Barbara. However the Tigers collected a 16th place finish at the Cowboy Classic; Rosenau led Pacific with a first round 68 on his way to a 25th place finish.

The golfers capped things off this past week in Rancho Santa Margarita for the Big West Conference Championship. Redshirt freshman Charles Van Sicklen led the Tigers, nearly cracking the Top 10 by shooting just five-over during the two-day tournament. Rosenau and Petersson have remained neck-and-neck in leading the Tigers, shooting 74.6 and 75.8 averages over the year. In addition, A.J. Hohn and Adam Beckman have all made contributions for the Tigers this semester.

### **COACH'S CORNER**

**Brandon Goethals**



With the 2005-2006 season at end I'd like to take a look back on everything we've accomplished as a team this year. First and foremost I'm very proud of the team for the effort they've put forth both on and off the golf course this year. To finish the Big West Championships with the final round being our low round of the year says a lot in my book. We got down but we didn't give up and remained consistant throughout the tournament. This team matured tremendously in the spring and I believe that it will carry over to next fall.

We had a lot of highlights throughout the year despite some of our less than stellar team finishes. Thomas Petersson earned Big West All-Conference Honorable Mention along with Academic All-America honors. Thomas also lowered his best collegiate round by three strokes, shooting a 68 at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate. Chris Rosenau lowered his yearly stroke average by two shots and finished the year with the low scoring average for the team (74.6). Charlie Van Sicklen came on strong at the end of the year averaging two shots lower in the spring and finishing the last two tournaments of the year with a scoring average of 73.5 (3.5 shots lower than his season average).

Overall, the team had four Top 5 finishes for the year and scored better as the year progressed, again, finishing the Big West with the low round of the year. We have a lot to accomplish over the summer and each individual will be given a plan as to how to get there. I'm excited about this summer and the recruiting process for the 2007 class. I look forward to our final newsletter in a few weeks to let you know how the team fared in the classroom and to let you know who won what team awards.

*First year head coach Brandon Goethals has wasted no time in reinventing the Pacific golf program, guiding the Tigers to a successful fall season in his first semester at the helm. The Tigers finished ninth in both the Lexus Classic and Santa Clara Invitational before ending the season with a fourth place showing at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate.*

*Before arriving at Pacific, Goethals had just completed his fourth year as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech under head coach Bruce Heppler. He helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a runner-up finish at the 2005 NCAA Golf Championships in Owings Mills, Maryland. He played a large part in recruiting the last three years, and successfully recruited four players over the course of two years that were ranked in the Top-30 nationally.*

## THOMAS PETERSSON

**Spring 2006** • Petersson finished his junior year with a 22nd place finish at the Big West Championship. Thomas picked up where he left off in the Tigers' first tournament of the spring season, leading Pacific to a fifth place finish at the Rice Intercollegiate on his way to a ninth place finish. Petersson shot a 76-75-72=223 enroute to his third Top 10 showing in six tournaments. He also took top honors for Pacific at the Anteater Invitational, finishing 15th and then carded a 234 at the Braveheart Classic.

**Fall 2005** • Petersson showed great improvement during the fall semester of his junior year, posting two Top-10 finishes at the Lexus Classic (T7) and the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate (8). He fired a career-low round of 68 in the Cullum and led the Tigers with a 74.4 stroke average. Thomas shot in the 70's in 13 of his 15 rounds as well.

**Spring 2006** • Van Sicklen played his best tournament of the year at the Big West Championship, finishing as the low man for the Tigers enroute to an 11th place finish. Charles remains a consistent on the Tiger squad; the redshirt freshman has played in every

tournament this year, shooting a 76-75-81=232 in the Rice Intercollegiate. He also posted a 83-78 at the Anteater and took top honors for the Tigers at the Braveheart Classic, posting a 74-78-78. Van Sicklen posted a career-low the next week at the Cowboy Classic, a 71 at Talking Stick North.

**Fall 2005** • Van Sicklen returned to the rotation after redshirting last year to play in all 15 rounds for Pacific, shooting a 78.1 average over five tournaments for the Tigers. As team captain, Charles was one of only three Tigers to play in every tournament during the fall season.

**Spring 2006** • A.J. shot an even par second round at the Big West Championship, putting his way towards 23rd place at the event. Hohn played his first spring tournament on Feb. 27, shooting a 156 at the Anteater; he followed that up with a 234 at the Braveheart Classic.

His 54-hole score was second for the Tigers. A.J. made noise at the Cowboy Classic as well, his final 71-72 put him in second for Pacific.

**Fall 2005** • Hohn made an impact in his first semester as a Tiger, playing in nine rounds, posting a season-low 71 at the Northwest Collegiate. He finished the fall season with a 76.8 stroke average and shot seven of nine rounds in the 70's.

**Spring 2006** • Rosenau shot a five-over, 54-hole score of 221 to take 16th at the Big West Championship. Chris continues to be a leader in only his second year as a Tiger, shooting a career-low 70 at the Rice

Intercollegiate while placing 12th. Rosenau earned the Tigers' only win in their dual match with Georgia Tech, winning 2-1. Three days later he led the Tigers at the Oregon Duck Invitational, shooting two rounds of par or better at Shadow Hills Country Club. He then fired a career-low 68 in the opening round of the Cowboy Classic, finishing 25th for Pacific.

**Fall 2005** • Rosenau had a stellar fall season, playing in all five tournaments in which he shot 14 of 15 rounds in the 70's. Chris accumulated the team's second best stroke average at 74.9 and finished in a tie for 17th at the Prestige.
