## TIGER GOLFERS END 2006 SEASON ON ACADEMIC HIGH NOTE

### VAN SICKLEN, LLARENAS AND ROSENAU EARN POST SEASON AWARDS UNDERCLASSMEN PRESENTED END-OF-THE-YEAR AWARDS

Pacific golf's Chris Rosenau was named the Ken Earle Player of the Year, Charles Van Sicklen took home the Dr. Glen Albaugh Most Improved Player award and Andrew Llarenas was presented with the Dr. Henry Zastrow Academic Achievement award for their efforts during the 2005-06 year.

The three postseason awards, created this year in junction with head coach Brandon Goethals and Ken Earle, Dr. Glen Albaugh and Dr. Henry Zastrow will be awarded to outstanding members of the Pacific golf team for years to come. All three men have been involved and contributed to the Pacific golf family throughout the programs history. It is in their honor and achievement that the Pacific golf program is proud to present these awards.

"I'm proud that we were able to establish these awards beginning this year," said head coach Brandon Goethals. "These achievements honor three men that have been, and are, very important to the Pacific golf program and I'm excited at what the awards will add to the history and tradition of this legacy."

Sophomore Chris Rosenau (Redding, Calif.) earned the Ken Earle Player of the Year award this season. He led the 2005-06 Tigers in scoring average and fewest strokes over the past season. He shot an average of 74.6 with four rounds at par or under in 32 rounds for Pacific. He also led the Tigers individually in four tournaments this past year.

Freshman Charles Van Sicklen (Stockton, Calif.) was awarded the Dr. Glen Albaugh Most Improved Player. Van Sicklen bounced back after redshirting last season to play in every tournament for the Tigers. Serving as team captain Charles fought hard down the stretch, improving his average and placed 11th in the Big West Championship.

Sophomore Andrew Llarenas (Kaneohe, Hawaii) took home the Dr. Henry Zastrow Academic Achievement award. Llarenas, who is majoring in business administration, earned the team's highest GPA this season. His academic achievements boost that of the Tigers who were awarded as Pacific highest team GPA this past spring.

## ROSENAU SWEEPS REDDING TOURNAMENTS

Pacific golfer Chris Rosenau is off to a good start this summer in preparation for next fall's golf season. The sophomore stroke leader for the Tigers this past season has collected wins in the Redding Searchlight Open and the Redding Pro-Am this past month.

Chris won the 36-hole Redding Open, shooting a 73-72=145 for a three-stroke victory at Gold Hills Golf Club, Sunday, June 4. He defended his title which he won last year in the NCGA Amateur Event.

A week later Rosenau shot a three-day score of 68-74-71=213 to repeat as the Redding Pro-Am's Amateur Champion. Rosenau's five stroke victory came at the par-72, Riverview Golf and Country Club.

"It feels good to win in my hometown and defend my titles in these two tournaments," said Rosenau, who will also play in a qualifier for the U.S. Amateur this July. "It's nice to get out there, play some good golf and prepare for this coming season."

The Tigers finished ninth in both the Lexus Classic and Santa Clara Invitational before ending the season with a fourth place showing at the Bill Cullum Interscholastic.*

*Before arriving at Pacific, Goethals had just completed his fourth year as an assistant coach at Georgia Tech under head coach Bruce Heppler. He helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a runner-up finish at the 2005 NCAA Golf Championships in Owings Mills, Maryland. He played a large part in recruiting the last three years, and successfully recruited four players over the course of two years that were ranked in the Top-30 nationally.*

**Spring 2006** • Petersson finished his junior year with a 22nd place finish at the Big West Championship. Thomas picked up where he left off in the Tigers' first tournament of the spring season, leading Pacific to a fifth place finish at the Rice Intercollegiate on his way to a ninth place finish. Petersson shot a 76-75-72=223 enroute to his third Top 10 showing in six tournaments. He also took top honors for Pacific at the Anteater Invitational, finishing 15th and then carded a 234 at the Braveheart Classic.

**Fall 2005** • Petersson showed great improvement during the fall semester of his junior year, posting two Top-10 finishes at the Lexus Classic (T7) and the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate (8). He fired a career-low round of 68 in the Cullum and led the Tigers with a 74.4 stroke average. Thomas shot in the 70's in 13 of his 15 rounds as well.

**Spring 2006** • Van Sicklen played his best tournament of the year at the Big West Championship, finishing as the low man for the Tigers enroute to an 11th place finish. Charles remains a consistent on the Tiger squad; the redshirt freshman has played in every

tournament this year, shooting a 76-75-81=232 in the Rice Intercollegiate. He also posted a 83-78 at the Anteater and took top honors for the Tigers at the Braveheart Classic, posting a 74-78-78. Van Sicklen posted a career-low the next week at the Cowboy Classic, a 71 at Talking Stick North.

**Fall 2005** • Van Sicklen returned to the rotation after redshirting last year to play in all 15 rounds for Pacific, shooting a 78.1 average over five tournaments for the Tigers. As team captain, Charles was one of only three Tigers to play in every tournament during the fall season.

**Spring 2006** • Rosenau shot a five-over, 54-hole score of 221 to take 16th at the Big West Championship. Chris continues to be a leader in only his second year as a Tiger, shooting a career-low 70 at the Rice

Intercollegiate while placing 12th. Rosenau earned the Tigers' only win in their dual match with Georgia Tech, winning 2-1. Three days later he led the Tigers at the Oregon Duck Invitational, shooting two rounds of par or better at Shadow Hills Country Club. He then fired a career-low 68 in the opening round of the Cowboy Classic, finishing 25th for Pacific.

**Fall 2005** • Rosenau had a stellar fall season, playing in all five tournaments in which he shot 14 of 15 rounds in the 70's. Chris accumulated the team's second best stroke average at 74.9 and finished in a tie for 17th at the Prestige.

## Season in Review

TIGERS IMPROVE THROUGHOUT 2005-06 SEASON

The Tigers have put together a spring campaign filled with the highs and lows that only golf can provide. Throughout the semester the golfers fought through their fair share of wind, rain and even darkness to play courses from Oregon to Texas and Arizona enroute to a successful spring season and a final fifth place finish at the Big West Championship.

The Tigers jumped out to a great start to the season as they finished fifth at the Rice Intercollegiate, shooting a 904 in the 14-team field. Junior Thomas Petersson led the Tigers with a 223, his third top-10 finish of the 2005-06 year. Pacific again took fifth place at the Anteater Invitational the following week, once again led by spring stroke leader Thomas Petersson (75.4). At the Braveheart Classic in Beaumont on March 6th and 7th it was redshirt freshman Charles Van Sicklen who led the Tigers as they struggled, finishing 17th.

A reunion of sorts followed on March 24th when the Tigers met nationally ranked Georgia Tech at storied Pasatiempo Golf Course in Santa Cruz, California. The dual match, between head coach Brandon Goethals former team, Georgia Tech and the Tigers pitted eight players from each team against each other in a match-play format. Sophomore Chris Rosenau (75.5) was the only Tiger to win as he defeated Cameron Tringale 2-1. Senior Gordian Curtius and junior Reid Scarff battled darkness but fell on their final holes to their Yellow Jacket counterparts one up.

Following the dual match it was off to Oregon as the Tigers took part in the Oregon Duck Invitational at Shadow Hills Country Club in Eugene. Rosenau stayed hot, shooting a first round even 72 and a final round one under but finished 27th. This past weekend heavy rains forced the cancellation of the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate in Santa Barbara. However the Tigers collected a 16th place finish at the Cowboy Classic; Rosenau led Pacific with a first round 68 on his way to a 25th place finish.

The golfers capped things off this past week in Rancho Santa Margarita for the Big West Conference Championship. Redshirt freshman Charles Van Sicklen led the Tigers, nearly cracking the Top 10 by shooting just five-over during the two-day tournament. Rosenau and Petersson have remained neck-and-neck in leading the Tigers, shooting 74.6 and 75.8 averages over the year. In addition, A.J.
