TIGERS HEAD TO THE EAST COAST FOR ADAM'S CUP

Pacific flies cross-country to take part in Rhose Island's Adam's Cup next week

Stockton, Calif. • The Pacific golf team is next at the 13th annual Adam's Cup in Newport, Rhode Island on September 25-27. The Tuesday - Wednesday tournament is held at the 7,244-yard Newport National Golf Course. The University of Rhode Island hosted event comes as the Tiger's second tournament of the fall season. Last year Texas A&M took the team title, shooting an 895 over the 54-hole event. Martin Ureta took home individual honors by shooting a 216.

Senior Thomas Petersson leads Pacific in the Tigers' first appearance at the tournament. He will be joined by juniors Chris Rosenau and A.J. Hohn. Team captain Charlie Van Sicklen qualified for the Adam's Cup and freshman Bayhaan Lakdawala will play in his first collegiate tournament at the Newport National Golf Course. The Tigers are coming off a 13th place finish at the Del Walker Intercollegiate and will look to improve their fall semester in Newport. Pacific is next at the 49er Collegiate Classic in Charlotte, North Carolina on October 22-24.

PETERSSON'S EIGHTH PLACE FINISH PACES TIGERS AT DEL WALKER INTERCOLLEGIATE

Tigers open fall semester with 13th place finish at Virginia Country Club

Long Beach, Calif. • Led by senior Thomas Petersson's eighth place individual finish on Friday, September 15, the Pacific golf team posted a final round 287 to end the Del Walker Intercollegiate in 13th place. Petersson fired a 69-74-71=214 to finish just two strokes off the lead.

After opening rounds of 295 and 299 the Tigers put together a combined round of three over par at the 6,633-yard Virginia Country Club. Pacific's 287 was the second best team round of the day, second only to San Jose State's 282.

Petersson continued his steady play through the final round, finishing with an even 71 to tie for eighth place. He finished at +1, 214 for the 54-hole event. Junior Chris Rosenau also shot a final round 71; posting a two-day score of 73-75-71=219 for a 30th place tie.

"We've got some work to do; that's clear enough," said coach Brandon Goethals. "We're certainly not where we want to be but we made a push today and we need to continue to improve."

St. Mary's College and Arkansas tied for the team championship with both schools firing 54-hole scores of 856 over the two day tournament. Individually San Jose State's Aaron Conrad was named individual champion after he won a playoff hole against Joe Panzeri of San Diego. Both men shot a 54-hole score of 212 at the par 71 course.

PACIFIC SENIOR PETERSSON WINS SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY AMATEUR

Petersson lone golfer under-par

Pacific senior golfer Thomas Petersson (Stockholm, Sweden) took home the San Joaquin County Amateur championship on Sunday, Sept. 10, at Swenson Park Golf Course in Stockton, Calif. Petersson won the tournament with a 6-under 138 two day total, four strokes ahead of the second place finisher.

For the tournament, Petersson was the lone golfer to come into the clubhouse under-par for both rounds as he fired off a 68 in round one and a 70 in round two. Consistent play led Petersson to the championship as he played the second day with six-birdies including two on his final two holes.

The win was Petersson's first in four attempts at the amateur tournament after not finishing in the top-10 in his first three tournaments.
