## FIRST PACIFIC GOLF ACADEMY HUGE SUCCESS

**Stockton, California** • The first annual Pacific Golf Academy, consisting of junior golfers from around Stockton and the Northern California area was held June 18-21. The golf camp, hosted at The Reserve at Spanos Park, consisted of four days of golf instruction, training, games and an Academy championship tournament the final day. The Academy, in head coach Brandon Goethals' vision, brought together 18 junior golfers to learn from himself and Rice University head coach Drew Scott. Assistant coach Jeremy Fletcher and Pacific soon-to-be senior A.J. Hohn also spent four days operating and teaching parts of the game of golf to the players. Awards accompanied the tournament winners; such as the Most Valuable Player Award, given to St. Mary's junior Danny Garcia and Camper of the Week to high school teammate Frank Esau. Nicholas Serra was awarded the GQ award for Best Dressed and numerous other prizes were given out to the academy members.



“It was great to have a top-level camp where you have a terrific group of kids that are also very talented young golfers,” said Goethals. “I enjoyed working with everyone we had out this week and I hope all our guys are back next year for an even bigger camp.” Dates for the 2008 camp have yet to be finalized but information about the Pacific Golf Academy can be found on the web at...

## FORMER TIGER THOMAS PETERSSON NOW CANADIAN TOUR PRO

**Canada** • Former Pacific golfer Thomas Petersson took top honors in the Canadian Tour Qualifying Tournament on June 7th, shooting a final round 70 to earn his tour card for the 2007-08 Canadian Tour season. Petersson, who graduated from Pacific this past May shot rounds of 66-63-68 and 70 to win by four strokes.

“Thomas' hard work over the past year at Pacific has really paid off,” said Pacific coach Brandon Goethals. “This has been his goal for quite some time to succeed professionally and with a start like this I'm sure we will see great things from him very soon.”

Following his Qualifying win Petersson took fifth in the Redding Pro-Am on June 15-18, shooting five under. He will play in seven tournaments this summer in Canada; for more information on his schedule and professional progress go

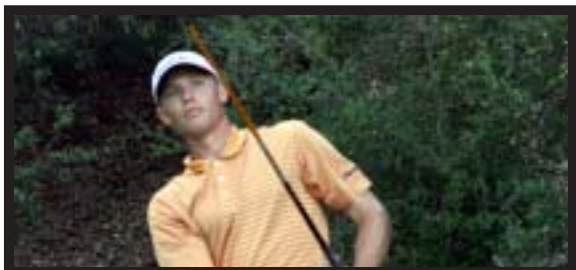

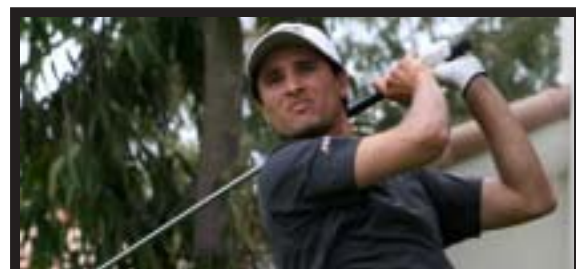
## PATRICK KUCICH

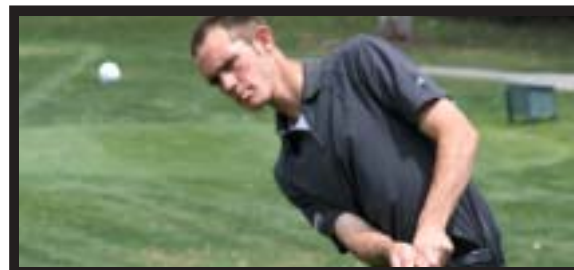

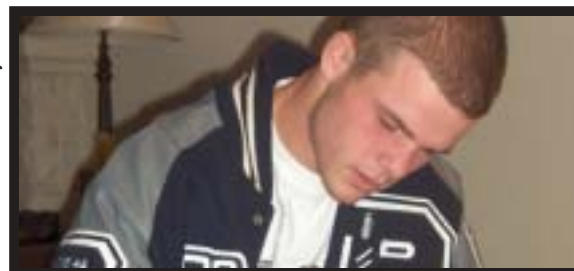
## ALEX GRIEB • SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA
