PACIFIC GOLF HOSTS ANNUAL TIGER HUNT

Tigers host annual fundraiser at Elkhorn then return to the East Coast

Stockton, Calif. • With the fall campaign in full swing the Tigers take a break from their schedule to host the annual Tiger Hunt at Elkhorn Country Club on October 9th. The tournament raised over \$40,000 this past year for the Pacific Golf program and looks to improve on that goal this year. A full day of golf and fun is highlighted with appearances by PGA professionals Jeff Brehaut and Matt Hansen. Numerous prizes and raffle items include golf packages and a six-night trip to Hawaii.

After the Tiger Hunt the golf team is back on the East Coast for the 49er Collegiate Classic in Charlotte, North Carolina on October 23rd and 24th. The University of Charlotte hosted event is held at the 7,116-yard, par 72 Cabbarus Country Club. In 2005 Charlotte took home the team title by posting a 54-hole score of 884 while Ray Sheedy took medalist honors with a three-round score of 212.

PACIFIC GOLF FINISHES SEVENTH AT ADAM'S CUP

Petersson and Van Sicklen tie for 17th

Middletown, Rhode Island • The Pacific golf team shot a final round 306 Wednesday morning to finish in seventh place at the Adam's Cup. The Tigers posted a 54-hole score of 304-298-306=908 at Newport National Golf Club.

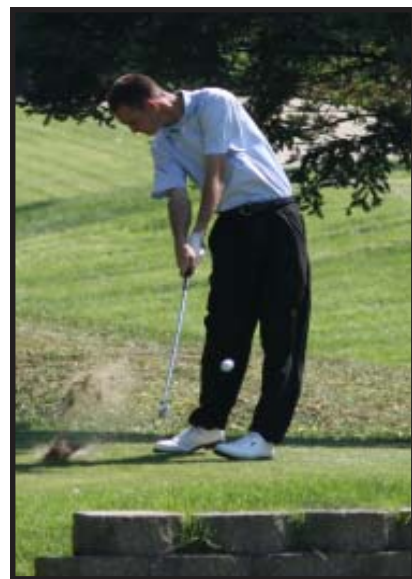
Senior Thomas Petersson once again led the Tigers, shooting a final round 75 to finish in a tie for 17th place. This time however, Petersson didn't go at it alone as sophomore Charles Van Sicklen also finished in 17th place with a 227 at the 7,244-yard course. Both players finished at +11 for the two-day event.

Also pacing the Tigers was junior Chris Rosenau and freshman Bayhaan Lakdawala. Rosenau finished with a 78 to tie for 28th while Lakdawala struggled down the stretch in his first collegiate tournament, shooting a final round 82. Junior A.J. Hohn finished with a 54-hole score of 236.

"We gave up some strokes today and that hurt us coming down the stretch," said head coach Brandon Goethals. "We ended up in the middle of the pack (in seventh) today and while that's not terrible it's not where we want to be. We're better than a "middle of the pack" team and we going to keep working until we get there."

The 2006 Adam's Cup team title went to the University of South Florida, who shot an 894 over the two-day event. Host school Rhode Island and nearby Hartford cruised into a tie for second place. Joel Myrick of Southern Mississippi maintained his first day lead to win the individual title with a final round 73.

Petersson and Van Sicklen each posted 54-hole totals of 227 to tie for 17th at the Adam's Cup in Rhode Island this past week.
