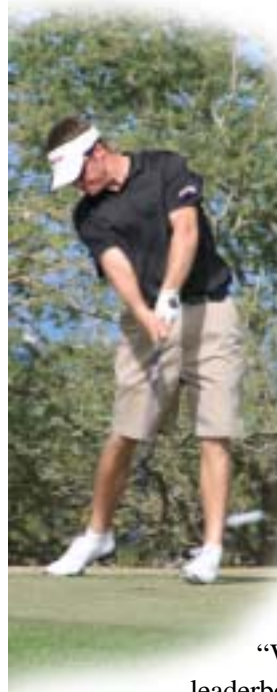
PACIFIC GOLF COMPLETES STRONG SHOWING AT UH HILO INTERCOLLEGIATE

Waikoloa, Hawaii - Playing among many of the nation's elite the Pacific golf team finished in 14th place at the UH-Hilo Intercollegiate February 7th. Posting a team best 281 in the second round the Tigers tacked on a final round 289 to finish with a three-day total of 854.

Four days of ideal playing conditions on the west side of Hawaii's Big Island paved the way for the two of the Tigers' best rounds in the past two years. The 6,738-yard, par-70 course played into the hands of the fields best short game players while the tricky Bermuda grass of the Waikoloa Village Course caused others problems.

Thomas Petersson consistently led Pacific throughout the tournament, opening with a 66, sitting in fourth place after day one. His four-under par round put him ahead of many of the nations best players including last years' national champion Jonathan Moore of Oklahoma State. Petersson continued his steady play with a second round 68 and finished in 18th with a final round 71.

Junior Chris Rosenau and sophomore Charlie Van Sicklen tied for 63rd place as both players shot a 215. Rosenau opened with a 72-71-72 while Van Sicklen carded rounds of 73-71-71. Meanwhile freshmen Bayhaan Lakdawala and Patrick Kucich rounded out the scoring for the Tigers with totals of 221 and 223, respectively.



"We're obviously not as high up on the leaderboard as we'd like to be but the improvements over the past year have been great," said coach Brandon Goethals. "There are certain things we can learn from after every tournament and this is no exception. I'm proud of the way our guys fought down the stretch and we look forward to taking some of those things learned with us as we continue the spring season."

TIGERS TRAVEL TO TEXAS FOR RICE INTERCOLLEGIATE

The Pacific golf team will be on the road this weekend at the Rice Intercollegiate in Houston, Texas. The Rice hosted event is played at the 6,700-yard Willowisp Country Club in Missouri City, Texas. The two-day event begins with 36-holes Saturday and a final 18 on Sunday.

Last season the Tigers took home 5th place in the 14-team tournament. Petersson posted a 223 to take home ninth place and Chris Rosenau shot a 2-under 70 in his final round to finish 12th.

With the program on the rise and recruiting now in Goethals' hands there are limitless possibilities to the heights the Tigers can achieve. With the Pacific Invitational turning into a premier event and impact players entering the line-up Goethals has the Tigers on the right path to national prominence.

Last season, Goethals' first as head coach at Pacific, the Tigers claimed seven Top 10 finishes. The team also had twelve individual rounds under par and 16 Top 25 individual finishes. Under Goethals' tutelage the Tigers completed a successful fall season, as they finished ninth at the Lexus Classic and the Santa Clara Invitational and placed fourth at the Bill Cullum Intercollegiate.

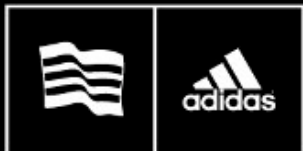

In the Bill Cullum he finished in fourth, his best showing at Pacific, shooting a 217. To start off the spring semester Thomas fired a career-low 66 in the first round of the UH Hilo Intercollegiate. He continued with a strong second and third round, finishing tied for 18th with many of the nations best players.

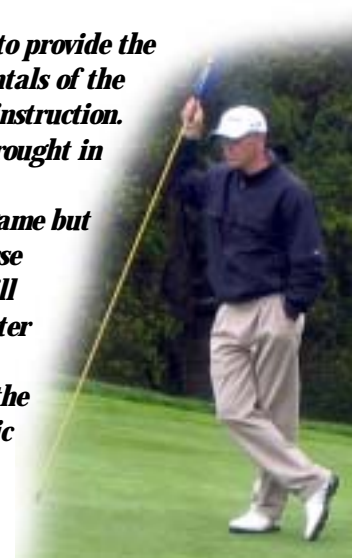
