TIGERS FINISH FOURTH AT RICE INTERCOLLEGIATE

PETERSSON ONE STROKE OUT; COLLECTS THIRD PLACE

Houston, Texas - The Pacific golf team closed out the Rice Intercollegiate with a third round 300 to finish fourth place, Sunday, February 17th. The Tigers carded a 54-hole score of 909, just nine strokes behind tournament champion Sam Houston State.

Senior Thomas Petersson placed a career-high third, only one stroke back from the individual champion Aaron O'Callaghan at the 7,184-yard Westwood Golf Club.

Petersson led the Tigers with a 74, giving him a 2-over 218 for the tournament after opening rounds of 71 and 73. Junior Chris Rosenau posted a final round 75 for 12th and sophomore Charlie Van Sicklen took home 24th, shooting a 74 during the final 18. Freshman Patrick Kucich and junior A.J. Hohn both ended at 240, tying for 53rd.

"We stuck with our mentality this final round," said coach Brandon Goethals. "We fought for every shot and didn't look to the final outcome but rather each shot at hand. I'm extremely proud of Thomas for his effort this week on a difficult golf course."

Last season the Tigers finished fifth on the shoulders of Petersson's ninth place finish.

Following the Fresno State hosted tournament the Tigers will take advantage of the University's spring break by playing multiple courses in head coach Brandon Goethals' home area of Redding, California. Pacific finishes up at the Western Intercollegiate on March 19-20, playing the storied Pasatiempo Country Club in Santa Cruz, California.

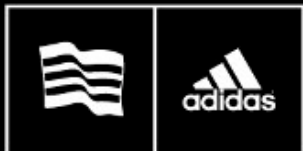

Fall 2006 • Thomas took senior leadership and led the Tigers in their first tournament of the year at the Del Walker Intercollegiate. Petersson finished just two strokes off the lead, good for eighth place, shooting a 69-74-71=214 for the 54-hole tournament. In the Bill Cullum he finished in fourth, his best showing at Pacific, shooting a 217. To start off the spring semester Thomas fired a career-low 66 in the first round of the UH Hilo Intercollegiate. He continued with a strong second and third round, finishing tied for 18th with many of the nations best players.

To kick off the spring campaign Van Sicklen joined the Tigers in Hawaii for the UH Hilo Intercollegiate where he posted rounds of 73-71-71 to finish in a tie for 63rd.

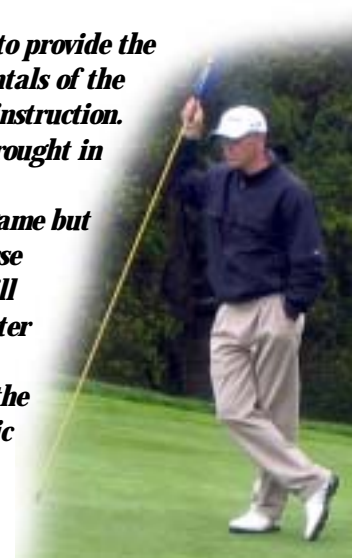
