TIGERS GO LOW IN FINISHING EIGHTH AT PACIFIC COAST INTERCOLLEGIATE

Santa Barbara, California - The Pacific golf team finished strong at the Ogio Pacific Coast Intercollegiate, posting a final round 285 to take eighth place. Senior Thomas Petersson and junior Chris Rosenau tied for 17th place, shooting scores of 210 to lead the Tigers to their first under-par tournament in more than five years.

Petersson shot a final round 69 while Rosenau posted a 74 at the 6,830-yard Alisal River Course. Junior A.J. Hohn shot his first tournament under par, posting a one-under 215 for the week while freshman Patrick Kucich finished at 219 and sophomore Charlie Van Sicklen at 223. Chris Kirk of Cal Poly took the individual title with rounds of 64-67-68 while his team took top honors by shooting 37 under par. The Tigers are off for three weeks until the Big West Championship at Tijeras Creek at the end of the month.

Behind a career-low 65 from junior Chris Rosenau the Pacific golf team shot a record 10-under par in the opening round of the Ogio Pacific Coast Intercollegiate, Monday, April 2. The Tigers' round of 278

was the lowest round for Pacific golf since 2001 and the first under-par round for the Tigers since Brandon Goethals took over as head coach in 2005.

Rosenau's seven-under par led Pacific to an opening round 278 and kept them in the hunt with a second round 290. The Tigers are currently tied for seventh at the 6,830-yard, par 72 course. Rosenau's second round 71 left him tied for 3rd place after day one.

"This is a huge step for our program," said Goethals. "Shooting ten under par at this point in the process for our team is a great achievement. It's also a bright spot and puts a smile on my face to see that we can compete at this level."

PACIFIC GOLF BATTLES BACK IN FINAL ROUND OF DUCK INVITATIONAL

Eugene, Oregon - The Pacific golf team battled back in the final round of the Oregon Duck Invitational to shoot the fourth best team round of the day. The Tigers rebounded with a combined 294 at Eugene Country Club Tuesday, March 27.

Senior Thomas Petersson once again led Pacific as he shot a final round 74 to finish at 225; 31st place. Sophomore Charlie Van Sicklen carded his first round under par of the spring season as he fired a one-under 71 at the 7,033-yard course. Junior A.J. Hohn and freshman Patrick Kucich both finished at 235, tying for 59th place while junior Chris Rosenau finished at 238.

"I'm extremely proud of the guys and the way we played out there today," said head coach Brandon Goethals. "We shot the fourth best final round in the tournament and everybody brought a good contribution to the cause. We just need to get to the point where we're doing that on a consistent basis and doing it every round."

USC freshman Jamie Lovemark took home medalist honors, helping the sixth ranked Trojans hold off Oregon, Oregon State and Arizona. USC had a three-round total of 868, six strokes better than Oregon State (874) and seven better than Oregon. Top-ranked Stanford was fifth at 880, while No. 9 UCLA and Washington tied for sixth at 887. No. 21 Arizona State took eighth at 889, followed by San Diego State (893), California (902) and Washington State (907).

TIGERS PREPARE FOR BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIP

Stockton, California - The Tigers are off for two weeks as they prepare for the Big West Championships at the end of the month. The Big West Championship once again takes place in Rancho Santa Margarita, California at Tijeras Creek Golf Course. Last season the Tigers took home fifth place at the end of the season tournament. Then freshman Charlie Van Sicklen led the Tigers with an 11th place finish while guiding the team to a season-low 292. The Tigers return all five players from the team they took down last year. The more experienced squad will qualify over the next week to determine which five players will represent the Tigers.

With the program on the rise and recruiting now in Goethals' hands there are limitless possibilities to the heights the Tigers can achieve. With the Pacific Invitational turning into a premier event and impact players entering the lineup Goethals has the Tigers on the right path to national prominence.

Last season, Goethals' first as head coach at Pacific, the Tigers claimed seven Top 10 finishes. The team also had twelve individual rounds under par and 16 Top 25 individual finishes. 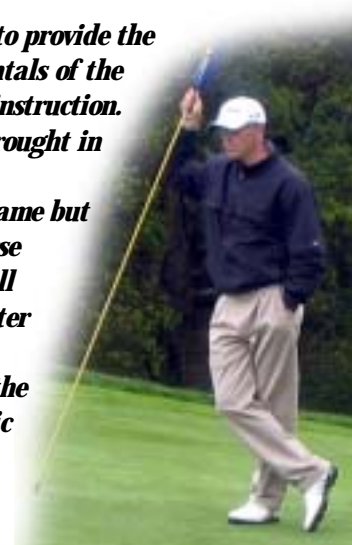
